“The early Church was quite sure that the whole of the Christian religion had an historical basis, that it was based on the earthly life of Christ, and that the story of that life must be told. But it was also certain that the earthly life and death were not the end, but that then came the resurrection. The basis was the historical facts, but these historical facts were not the sum total of everything.
