“At the climax of the Genesis account of creation, we see God bringing woman and man together to unite them in marriage. The Bible begins with a wedding (Adam and Eve) and ends in the book of Revelation with a wedding (Christ and the church). Marriage is God’s idea. It is certainly also a human institution, and it reflects the character of the particular human culture in which it is embedded. But the concept and roots of human marriage are in God’s own action and therefore what the Bible says about God’s design for marriage is crucial.”
