“We can indeed agree that in both drunkenness and the fullness of the Spirit, two strong influences are at work within us—alcohol in the bloodstream and the Holy Spirit in our hearts. But, whereas excessive alcohol leads to unrestrained and irrational license, transforming the drunkard into an animal, the fullness of the Spirit leads to restrained and rational moral behavior, transforming the Christian into the image of Christ. Thus, the results of being under the influence of spirits on the one hand and of the Holy Spirit on the other are utterly different. One makes us like beasts, the other like Christ.”
