- A legal statement of position of the believer's standing in Christ and the implication of such standing.
- A declaration of Christian

truth \_\_\_\_\_ concerning the expense, extend and intent of saving faith.

An exploration of the

<u>significance</u> of the sacrificial death of Christ for sinful humanity and the security shared by believers through grace.

- A **letter** written to a group of believers with the expressed purpose of clarifying, affirming and challenging the reality of the Gospel in daily life.
