 - "Excessive relational demands have crippled our relational capacities."
- The pace of life and its many distractions encourage insensitivity and isolation.

- The exposure to many unhealthy evangelism models has left many frustrated and disillusioned.
- The imbalance between the verbalization and the incarnation of the gospel.
