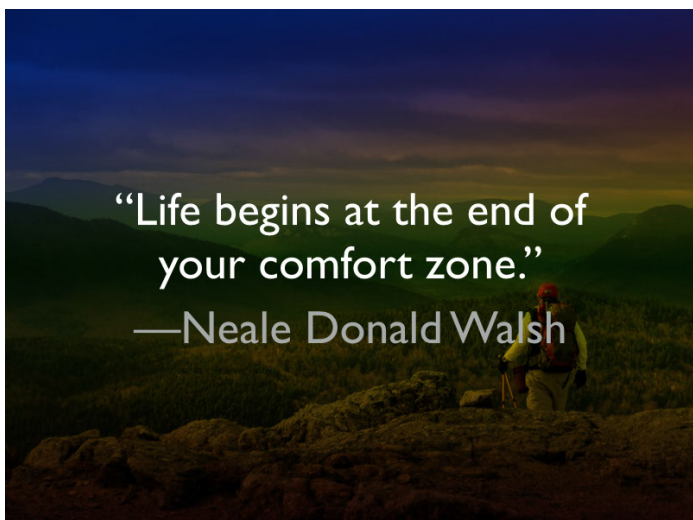
Palmer hit a fine drive.

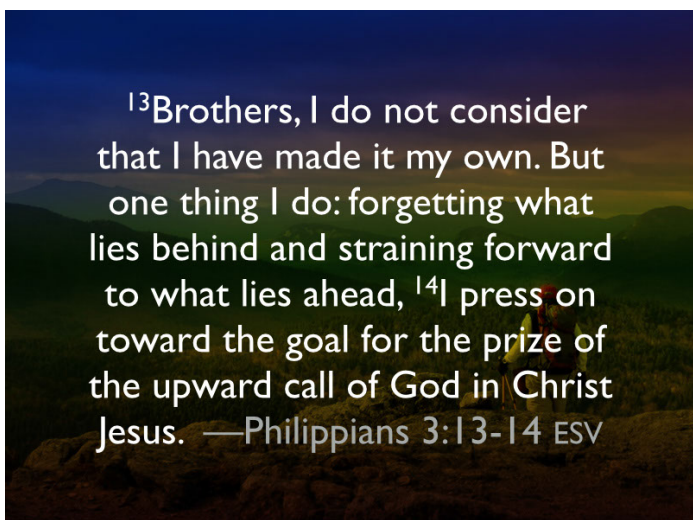

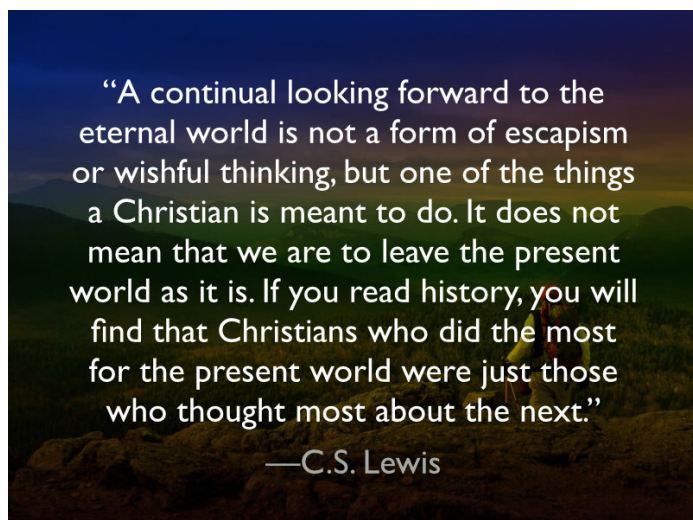
