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Repentance vs. Tolerance

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“Repentance is simply that process by which a person who is away from God recognizes that situation and goes back to God... repentance always takes place in relation to someone—always in relation to God, and sometimes in relation to other people as well.

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Repentance is never a private affair. God created us to live in relationships—first with himself, and then with others. That is the reason why religions that do not have a personal God of grace with whom we may enjoy a loving relationship, and from whom it is possible to stray, have no proper place for repentance.”

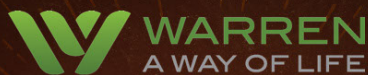
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The Mission Proceeding From
